Police Officers Receive Awards

On May 29, 2022 multiple police departments were involved in the pursuit of a vehicle driven by a suspect who earlier committed a double homicide in Valley Township and then committed a carjacking and kidnapping at gunpoint in Coatesville City. Corporal Timothy Pohlig (center), Officer Jonathan Regan (left) and Officer Christopher Traini (right) were on duty at the time. The pursuit culminated in front of the Wawa at Lincoln Highway and Marshallton-

Thorndale Road in Caln Township. The suspect exited the vehicle and placed a semi-automatic pistol under his chin. From a distance of about 25 feet away, and after approximately 40 minutes of verbally communicating with the suspect, Corporal Pohlig negotiated a peaceful surrender, without further loss of life or injury to anyone involved or nearby. He was assisted by Officers Regan and Traini who played keys roles as the incident evolved. Fittingly, Corporal Pohlig was awarded 2022 Police Officer of the Year, and Officers Regan and Traini were recipients of the department's Distinguished Service Award at an award ceremony on January 12, 2023. During the award presentation Chief Joseph Elias stated, "The officers relied on their training and experience, and they demonstrated a degree of professionalism in keeping with the finest traditions of law enforcement service."

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) describes a variety of substances which can not be disposed of in your regular trash. Chester County offers HHW disposal events throughout the county each year. The nearest event will take place on **Friday**, **June 23 at the CCIU** in Coatesville. You **must** pre-register online for a drop off time at www.chestercountyswa.org (Go to Household Hazardous Waste – Upcoming Events)

Identify HHW by looking for words like: Caution, Combustible, Corrosive, Danger, Explosive, Flammable, Hazardous, Poisonous, Reactive, Toxic, and Warning. Find a complete list of HHW items at the link above.
