Yard Waste Collection Begins March 26

Caln Township is pleased to offer residents our popular Yard Waste Collection Program every other Friday from 5AM - 5PM beginning on March 26th (for Monday/Tuesday trash customers). Spring Chipping Program

The Township will continue to offer its scheduled chipping program for large branches. This service is only intended for cleaning up fallen branches in your yard and not for items cut down by a contractor. To sign up for a chipping slot, please call 610-384-0600 x140 between April 1 and April 30th.

- All branches must be neatly stacked curbside (no cross stacking), no larger than 6" in diameter and with cut ends facing the street by 6:00 AM the day of your appointment (recommended the night before). Road crews will not drive onto property or private lanes/road ways, nor will road crews go beyond the edge of the property to collect the branches.
- Appointments will be limited to 15 minutes with NO EXCEPTIONS.
- Branches greater than 6" in diameter will NOT be accepted.
- Vines, stumps, weeds, leaves, and yard waste will NOT be collected.
- Incorrectly stacked piles will NOT BE PICKED UP.
- NO LATE SET OUTS OR OVERSIZED PILES WILL BE ACCEPTED.
- THE PROGRAM IS FOR ROUTINE CLEAN-UP AND NOT DESIGNED TO ASSIST WITH CLEARING PROPERTIES OF TREES AND SHRUBS

Caln Spring Coloring Contest

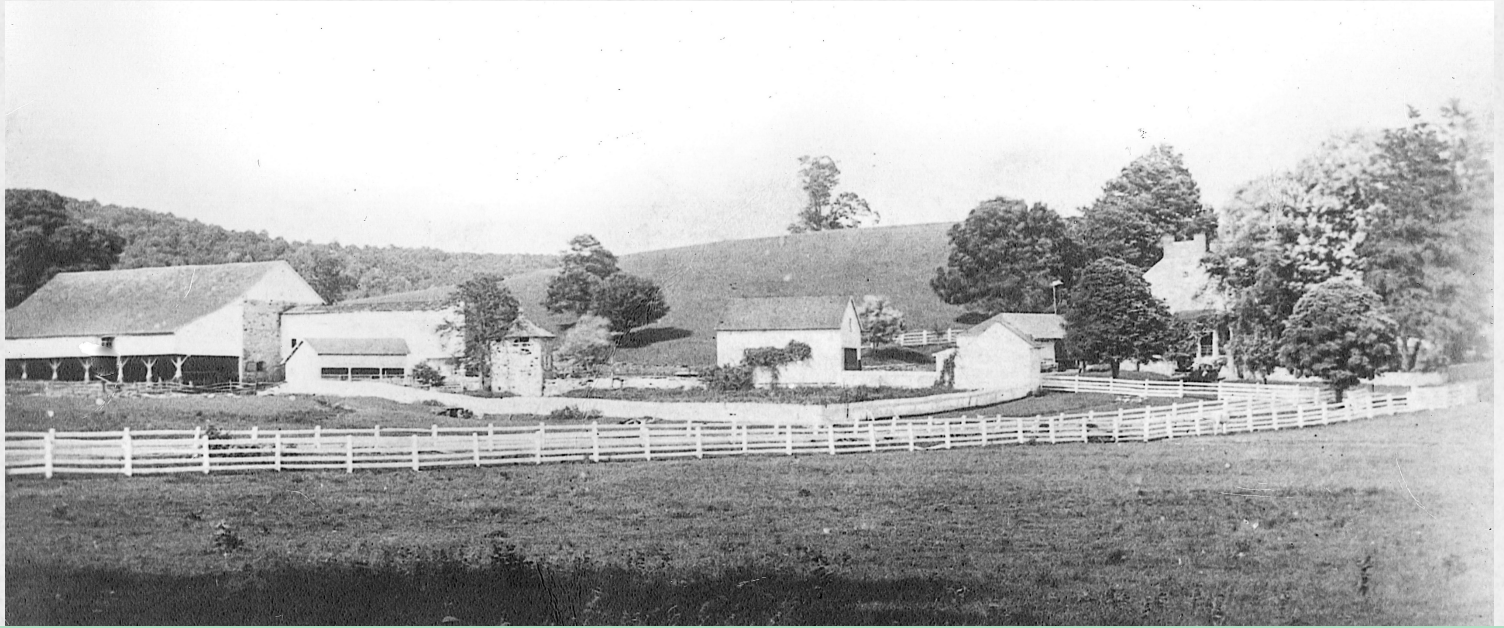
Caln Township Parks and Recreation invites you to participate in our Spring Coloring Contest!

FROM THE CALN HISTORICAL COMMISSION



Can you spot Caln's Hexagonal Schoolhouse in the photo above? It's next to the large barn on the left. This photo depicts the Pim farm which once stretched from Bailey Road to Bondsville Road. Richard and Mary Pim built "Greenwood," the manor house (peeking from behind the trees on the right) which is still standing on Edge Lane.

Over the years, parcels of the property were sold off and eventually, the barns and schoolhouse fell into disrepair. For the Township's Centennial in 1968, the unique schoolhouse building was moved down the road to the Township property and restored. The schoolhouse remains a symbol of Caln Township and can be found on the Township seal. You can learn more about the schoolhouse and other township history at www.CalnTownship.org/history.
