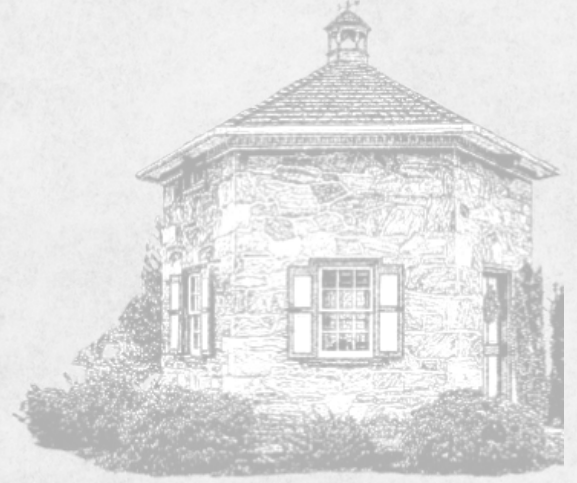

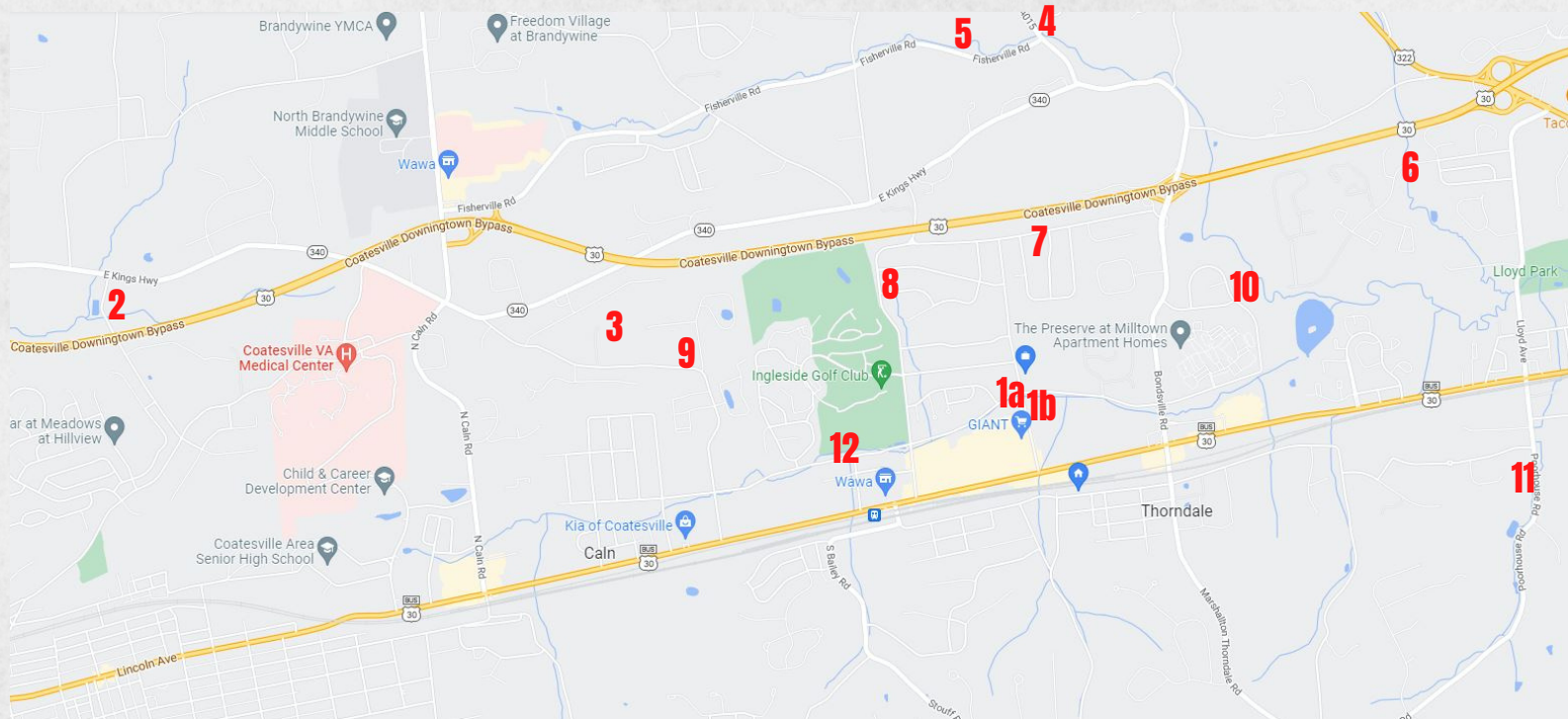

Storm Ida-Related Projects

The following is a list of Caln Township infrastructure projects intended to address damage caused or exacerbated by Storm Ida. Some of the projects are eligible for partial reimbursement by FEMA and the Township is working diligently to follow all FEMA regulations in order to maximize our reimbursements. In order to be eligible for partial FEMA reimbursement, projects must be completed within 18 months of the federal disaster declaration (by March 2023, in our case). As we work through the engineering and bid process for these projects, status updates will be provided.

- Subdivision and Land Development Plan submitted, will be on on the March 25, 2022 Planning Commission Agenda
- Stormwater/grading permit approved.
- The Board of Commissioners granted conditional use approval at their October 29, 2020 meeting.
- Seeking conditional use approval for a 120 unit apartment complex with community building.

Hills at Thorndale Woods (housing development between GL Eggleston Blvd. and S. Caln Road)

- Conditional approval of final plan granted at 3/10/22 Board of Commissioners Meeting - contingent on satisfying outstanding consultant and staff review letters
- Planning Commission voted to recommend conditional final land development approval at September 17, 2019 meeting.
- Received preliminary plan approval in 2002.
