Yard Waste Collection Program

Starting April 1st and continuing through December 17th, Caln Township is pleased to once again offer residents the popular Yard Waste Collection Program every other Friday. Leaves and grass clippings should be in biodegradable paper bags (no more than 5). Branches should be bundled with twine - less than 5 feet long and 17 inches in diameter (no branches over 2 inches in diameter). No plastic bags will be collected.

Curbside Recycling

In 2016, 62% of residential waste in the Township went to the landfill. The Environmental Protection Agency estimates that 75% of all waste could be recycled, but that only 30% actually is. We can do better! In addition to being better for the environment, recycling leads to substantial savings for the Township and keeps your service costs low. With co-mingled recycling pick up right outside your

A MESSAGE FROM THE Manager

Spring greetings to the wonderful residents of Caln Township. I would like to introduce myself as your new Township Manager, Kristen Denne. I started with the Township in October of 2016 and have found Caln Township to be a gem of a community that boasts a wonderful quality of life, along with the convenience of shopping and transportation amenities. I have been in municipal management for fifteen years and delight in the opportunity to share my knowledge and work collaboratively with residents to make Caln Township one of the leading communities of Chester County. Starting my tenure with the Township in October, meant that I had to quickly immerse myself in the 2017 Budget Process with the Board of Commissioners. The process of a budget is

always daunting, but I can say first hand that the Commissioners were very hands on in the process and worked diligently to ensure that tax dollars are used in an efficient and effective manner for the good of the entire community. The Budget was passed with a slight tax increase that allows for the sustainability of the general fund in future years and the ability to complete necessary capital projects.



Some of our capital projects for this year include:

- \$450,000 of road paving and repairs
- Purchase of a Boom Mower for maintenance of Public Spaces
- New Dump Truck for Public Works Department
- Fleet Vehicles for Police and Administration
- A new roof for the Municipal Building
- Demolition of a blighted property at Ingleside Golf Course
- Purchase of an Automated License Plate Reader for the Police
 Department to assist in Traffic Control throughout the Community

The Township Officials realize that any tax increase is a burden to residents and work very hard to avoid increase and maintain services at current levels, but there are significant capital needs that the Township is facing regarding infrastructure and this increase will relieve some of that burden in upcoming years.

The Township is anticipating a very active summer in our beautiful parks and hopes to see all of our residents enjoying the recreational amenities that are so conveniently located in the community. Whether it be watching a baseball game at the little league field at Caln Park, taking a brisk walk along G.O. Carlson Boulevard, or driving golf balls at Ingleside Golf Course, there are wonderful amenities to be enjoyed by residents of all ages. The Township will also continue the very popular summer series and hopes that your family will join us for the fun filled evening in our parks.

On an ending note, I am ecstatic to be a new face in the community and look forward to hearing from residents on how to make Caln Township a great place to call home. Her civility and communications skills, and the manner in which she engages the public, far exceeds the highest standards of police officer performance.

Her selfless efforts are tireless and inspirational. Most importantly she manages to perform these additional duties, with enthusiasm and without complaint, while maintaining a high standard of performance in her primary responsibility of patrol. ReadyChesCo

ReadyChesCo is used to notify you during a major crisis or emergency, and delivers important emergency alerts; such as weather, road closures, health, or community alerts. You can choose to sign up by county, municipality, or by topic.

Notifications and updates can be delivered to you on all your devices: email account (work, home, other), cell phone (via SMS), pager.

Registration takes only a few minutes! You can register by visiting www.readychesco.org

It is free to sign up for ReadyChesCo, and you can choose the type of alerts that you get. Your wireless carrier may charge you to get messages on your device, so check your plan to see what is covered. You can choose to stop getting these messages at any time.



Plan Ahead for Any Emergency

Sign up for Smart911 so first responders will be aware of important information to help you when you call 9-1-1.



Smart 911

What if there's a fire, a medical emergency, or a child goes missing? When you dial 9-1-1 under stress, you may not have access to important details, or you may have trouble remembering them. Smart911 is a new service in Chester County that allows you to create a Safety Profile at www.smart911.com that includes details you want the 9-1-1 center and public safety response

teams to know about your household in an emergency. When you dial 9-1-1, from a phone associated with your Safety Profile, that information automatically displays to the 9-1-1 call taker, allowing them to send responders based on up-to-date location and emergency information. With your Safety Profile, responders can arrive aware of many details they would not otherwise know. Fire crews can arrive knowing exactly how many people live in your home and where the bedrooms are located. EMS personnel can know family members' allergies or specific medical conditions. And police can access a photo of a missing family member in seconds rather than minutes or hours, helping the search start faster.

A Royal Farms gas station and convenience store is currently under construction at the intersection of Lloyd Ave. and Manor Ave.




Easter Egg Hunt
