Caln Township has been actively participating in meetings with other Western Chester County Municipalities working on forming the Western Chester County Council of Governments. Municipalities that are in the Western Chester County Chamber service area have been asked to participate. The group had a very successful first meeting (May 2) with 14 of our Chamber's 19 municipalities participating by showing interest in forming the COG and forming a list of potential projects to work on.

At that meeting a sub-committee of 5 elected officials from various municipalities was formed to review and suggest a draft COG agreement and ordinance. The Municipalities have been asked to bring this agreement to the governing officials for approval. Hopefully the COG will be up and running by the end of 2012.

Caln TownWatch – IT IS IMPORTANT!

YOU CAN HELP CALN TOWNSHIP DETECT STREAM POLLUTION!

Caln Township, as well as many other communities in the Southeastern Pennsylvania region, recently was required to obtain a permit from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection for its storm drainage system. This permit required Caln Township to locate and map all stormwater piping and drainage ditch systems owned and maintained by the Township. The permit also requires the Township to inspect these drainage systems periodically to detect any "illicit discharges" from the systems.

What in the world is an illicit discharge? Simply stated, an illicit discharge is something that is exiting a storm drainage pipe or drainage ditch that is not stormwater and potentially could pollute our streams. Examples of illicit discharges that would be typical for a community like ours are septic system overflows, sanitary wastewater, chlorinated pool water, paints, oil or other vehicle fluids, etc.

While the Township inspects its drainage system thoroughly, our Highways Department personnel cannot be everywhere all the time. If you happen to see something exiting a storm pipe or ditch that looks, smells or feels like something other than stormwater, please contact the Township's Engineering Department so we can track it to its source and keep our streams as clean and pure as possible. LEAF COLLECTION

Leaf collection will begin the week of October 22, 2012 with bag pickup. Leaf bags are **NO LONGER** available for purchase at the Caln Township building. Bags can be purchased at local hardware stores. Besides leaf bag pickup, the Township will again be vacuuming. Rather than bagging your leaves, you need to only rake them to the front of your property immediately adjacent to the road's edge. **LEAVES MUST BE AS CLOSE TO THE ROAD'S EDGE AS POSSIBLE.**

PLEASE DO NOT RAKE LEAVES INTO THE STREET as leaves could get washed into storm inlets during inclement weather or can freeze to the roadway as we get cooler temperatures.

FROM THE CALN POLICE DEPARTMENT

Prevent Theft ~ Lock Your Vehicle

The majority of vehicle break-ins occur outside private homes in driveways or on the street in front of the victim's home. Thefts from vehicles would be drastically reduced if people would lock their car doors and stop leaving valuables inside their vehicles. Leaving items on display, whether in or on a dashboard or in a mounted cradle, or sitting on the passenger seat, is an open invitation to opportunist criminals.

Tips for Protecting Valuables:

If You Have a Garage ~ Use It rather than parking outside where your vehicle is more vulnerable. When parking in a garage, lock the garage door and your vehicle. Locking both the garage and vehicle doors, the chances of deterring a thief greatly improve.

Remove All Items of Value such as handbags, wallets, cell phones, MP3 players, iPods, laptops, GPS's from the car when you are not driving. Take out removable radios and faceplates. Engrave expensive accessories. Don't leave anything in your glove compartment or center console – it is the first place thieves look.

Don't Cover Items in Your Car with a Blanket or Jacket. Ideally, you should take them with you, but if unavoidable, place them in the trunk prior to arriving at your destination.

Completely Close All Car Windows

Park in a Well-Lit Area Close to Your Destination

Avoid Parking Between Large Vehicles - they provide cover for thieves.

Use Outdoor Lighting - porch and motion lights help deter crime.

Don't Leave the Registration or Title in Your Car. Your car registration has your address on it. File the title at your home or office, and carry registration in your purse or wallet.

Record Serial Numbers of Your Valuables

Get involved! Be your neighbor's eyes and ears. Talk to neighbors regarding activity in the neighborhood. By becoming familiar with those who belong in your neighborhood, you can help reduce crime.



Bagster - a Dumpster in a Bag!

You're ready to take on your next project. But what's the best way to handle all the waste? Now there's the "Bagster - a Dumpster in a Bag", a new service of waste removal from Waste Management, the Township's waste collector. When a dumpster is too big for the job, check out the Bagster® bag, as a cost-effective alternative. It's ready to go when you are, so you can take on the projects you want to, when you want to.

The Bagster is a highly durable woven bag that can hold three cubic yards of debris and up to 3,300 pounds, including full sheets of plywood, doors and even a bathtub. Users can purchase a Bagster and use it for as long as they need. When the project is complete or the Bagster is full, customers can schedule collection online or over the phone, and a local Waste Management crew will collect the Bagster from the curb within three business days.

Bagsters are available at the Caln Township Municipal Building and several area stores. The Bagster costs \$29.95. Once you are ready to have the full Bagster picked up you call a toll free number for a pickup time. Hauling costs are based on weight and market, but are currently \$119.00. Below is a sample of what is accepted and what is not accepted in a Bagster.

Drought Conditions Raise Fire Risk to High

We want to remind everyone that Chester County remains in a drought condition and as such the fire danger remains high. While Caln Township has a NO BURN Ordinance, we want you to be mindful of the drought situation and be extremely cautious with anything that could create a spark and subsequent fire resulting in a major problem with possible loss of property or even life in a matter of seconds. We should all be reminded of the recent catastrophes in Colorado and how many homes and lives were lost. Also a reminder to all SMOKERS - mind your debris. Throwing it into mulch or throwing it out the window as it can result in a rapid fire spread.

The fire situation is explosive and can result in extensive property damage. Fires under extreme conditions start quickly, spread furiously, and burn intensely. All fires are potentially serious. As a result of the conditions, fires start very easily and spread at a very fast rate. Fires start easily from all causes, spread rapidly and intensify quickly. Spot fires are a constant danger. Fires burning in heavy fuels may quickly develop high-intensity characteristics, such as long-distance spotting and fire whirlwinds. Fighting fires under these conditions also prove to be challenging to the firefighters due to the rapid spread of the conflagration. We urge everyone to keep fire safety at the forefront of everything you do. Stay Safe and Be Careful.

TREE TRIMMING ALONG ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAYS


The Township Highways Department will be cutting back overhanging branches, brush and vegetation from the Township roadways as required to maintain clear and passable roadways. Overhanging trees obstruct the roadway when they are weighed down by snow, creating difficult situations for our snow removal vehicles. Please check the road frontage of your property to see if your trees or shrubs may be overhanging the road or obstructing street signs. If you prefer to prune back your own trees or shrubs, please use the following guidelines.

1. Tree branches and bushes should be clear of the road edge by a minimum of (24") two feet and that clearance should extend to (10') ten feet in height.
2. New plantings, i.e trees, shrubs, etc. should not be planted within the road right-of-way! Please contact the Township Zoning Office for the specifications prior to planting to avoid excess work.

REMINDER!

Coatesville and Downingtown area schools will be back in session in late August. Please watch for children exiting and/or entering school buses.

Maintain safe traveling distances at all times. Observe speed limits and flashing yellow lights within school zones.

CHIPPING PROGRAM

THE CHIPPING PROGRAM WAS DESIGNED TO ASSIST RESIDENTS, FREE OF CHARGE, WITH REMOVAL OF DOWNED TREE LIMBS AND BRANCHES. REQUESTS FOR THE FALL 2012 CHIPPING PROGRAM CAN BE MADE STARTING THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 6, 2012. APPOINTMENTS ARE REQUIRED. THE FIRST AVAILABLE APPOINTMENT FOR THE FALL 2012 CHIPPING PROGRAM IS TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 18, 2012. THE PROGRAM WILL RUN WEEKLY TUESDAYS AND THURSDAYS THROUGH NOVEMBER 6, 2012. APPOINTMENTS WILL BE TAKEN THROUGH FRIDAY, OCTOBER 5, 2012 OR UP UNTIL ALL APPOINTMENT SLOTS ARE TAKEN. TO SCHEDULE AN APPOINTMENT CALL 610-384-0600 X120.

IN AN EFFORT TO ACCOMMODATE ALL REQUESTS FOR APPOINTMENTS, WE ASK THAT THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES BE ADHERED TO:

- ALL BRANCHES AND LIMBS MUST BE STACKED AT THE FRONT OF THE PROPERTY NEXT TO THE STREET (WHERE TRASH CANS ARE PLACED FOR PICKUP).
- NOTE: DUE TO LIABILITY CONCERNS, THE ROAD CREWS WILL NOT DRIVE ONTO PROPERTY OR PRIVATE LANES/ROADWAYS, NOR WILL ROAD CREWS GO BEYOND THE EDGE OF THE PROPERTY TO COLLECT THE LIMBS.
- ALL BRANCHES SHOULD FACE THE SAME DIRECTION (NO CROSS-STACKING) WITH THE BLUNT/CUT END FACING THE STREET
- NO STUMPS OR LIMBS GREATER THAN 8" IN DIAMETER, NO VINES, WEEDS, LEAVES, OR YARD WASTE WILL BE COLLECTED
- A RESIDENT MAY USE THIS FREE SERVICE ONE TIME DURING THE PROGRAM PERIOD

THE PROGRAM IS FOR ROUTINE CLEANUP AND NOT DESIGNED TO ASSIST WITH CLEARING PROPERTIES OF TREES AND SHRUBS (I.E. CUTTING TREES DOWN AND PUTTING OUT FOR CHIPPING WILL NOT BE COLLECTED).
