Caln Township Promotes Three Officers



The Caln Township Police Department is pleased to announce the promotion of three of our officers. On February 15, 2009 Sgt Jeffrey Nash was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant. Lieutenant Nash is a fifteen year veteran of the police department. Lieutenant Nash is responsible for the day to day operations of the police department. He is in command of both the patrol and investigative units. Lieutenant Nash is a graduate of the 232nd session of the FBI National Academy in Quantico Virginia.

On March 1, 2009 Officer Christine Cusick and Officer Christopher Sambuco were promoted to the rank of Sergeant. Sergeant Cusick is a ten year veteran of the police force. She also serves as one of the Township's crime prevention officers. Sergeant Cusick is also a hostage negotiator for the Western Chester County Emergency Response Team. Sergeant Sambuco is a seven year veteran of the police force. Sergeant Sambuco is also a tactical squad leader for the Western Chester County Emergency Response Team. Both Sergeants will be responsible for managing a patrol team.

All three officers were sworn into their new roles on April 9, 2009 by the Honorable Ronald C. Nagle, Judge of the Court of Common Pleas Chester County, PA. We are very proud of Lieutenant Nash, Sergeant Cusick and Sergeant Sambuco and wish them all the best. We know they will do well.

Caln Township Recognizes Young Man's Heroics

On Thursday April 9, 2009, the Caln Township Board of Commissioners awarded six-year old Gavin Patel with a Citizen's Life-Saving Medal for his heroic actions on July 29, 2008. The award was bestowed upon Gavin after the Police Department's Honor Review Board reviewed the incident and determined his actions were extraordinary for his age and under the circumstances, resulted in saving a life.

In the early afternoon of Tuesday, July 29, 2008, Gavin Patel was home alone with an adult family member. Gavin discovered this family member unconscious and unresponsive. Without panicking, Gavin ran to a neighbor's house to request assistance in calling for an ambulance. Gavin then led paramedics and police to the patient and provided them with necessary information on the patient's life-threatening diabetic condition. The paramedics on the scene agreed that if Gavin panicked or hesitated to summon help, this family member would have suffered a much more serious injury or even death.

The Police Department, Board of Commissioners, and the citizens of Caln Township salute young Gavin Patel for his heroic actions that resulted in the preservation of the most precious gift of all, a human life.

COMMISSIONERS HONOR OFFICERS


On Thursday April 9, 2009, the Caln Township Board of Commissioners honored several Police Officers for acts of heroism and outstanding performance. Officer Jason Culbertson received the Police Department's Distinguished Service Medal for rescuing two residents trapped in their burning home, in the 1100 block of Olive Street in the City of Coatesville on January 21, 2009.

Sergeant Christopher Sambuco received the Police Department's Distinguished Service Medal for apprehending an emotionally disturbed individual armed with a knife who was attempting to harm both himself and police. This incident occurred on July 8, 2008 in the area of South 6th Avenue in the City of Coatesville.

Sergeant Sambuco was awarded the Police Department's Meritorious Service Medal for apprehending an armed shooting suspect after giving foot chase through the Regency Park area of the City of Coatesville on May 18, 2008. The suspect was wanted for questioning in a shooting and fled from Sergeant Sambuco who eventually captured the suspect and recovered a hand gun and large quantity of drugs.

Sergeant Sambuco and Officer Nathan Miller both received Letters of Commendation for capturing a suspect wanted for attempted murder who was hiding in a residence in the 300 block of West Lincoln Highway in the City of Coatesville. Sergeant Sambuco and Officer Miller made a tactical dynamic entry into the dwelling and safely apprehended the suspect who vowed not to be "taken alive".

Officer Steven Parkinson received a Letter of Commendation from the Board of Commissioners for his exemplary performance for the period of June 16, 2008 through June 26, 2008 in which Officer Parkinson made 10 criminal arrests and recovered over \$50,000 in stolen property.



SINCE CALN TOWNSHIP NOW HAS SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING WHEREBY ALL RECYCLABLES CAN BE PLACED IN THE SAME RECYCLING CONTAINER, WE HAVE AVAILABLE FOR SALE, 65 GALLON HEAVY-DUTY PLASTIC RECYCLING CONTAINERS. EACH CONTAINER CONTAINS A SERIAL NUMBER SO IN CASE IT GETS BLOWN DOWN YOUR STREET, IT WILL BE EASY TO IDENTIFY. CONTAINERS CAN BE PURCHASED AT THE TOWNSHIP BUILDING – THE COST IS \$50 FOR EXISTING HOUSES AND \$25 FOR NEW HOUSES OR NEW HOUSING DEVELOPMENTS. DUE TO THEIR SIZE, IF YOU CANNOT FIT IT IN YOUR VEHICLE, TOWNSHIP PERSONNEL WILL DELIVER IT TO YOUR HOUSE AT NO ADDITIONAL CHARGE. THE SMALLER RECYCLING CONTAINERS ARE NO LONGER AVAILABLE.

Lease Agreement with Transcontinental Corporation

The Commissioners have approved an 18 month lease agreement with the Transcontinental Gas Corporation to lease 17 acres of Township property located on the south side of Kings Highway near North Bailey Road. Transcontinental Corporation will use the property as a temporary storage area for equipment and materials during an upcoming project. The Township will receive a lease payment for use of the property. This site was selected for its location and size and because it had the least impact on area-wide traffic and adjacent land uses.

None of the actual Transcontinental Gas Corporation's pipe installation work is scheduled for properties within Caln Township. Once the project is completed, Transcontinental Gas Corporation will restore the site to its previous condition.

PROPER DISPOSAL OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS

Federal prescription drug disposal guidelines urge Americans to:





FROM THE CODES DEPARTMENT...



The Code Enforcement office would like to remind the residents of Caln Township that plot plans are a required item for both Building and Zoning Permit submittal. Plot plans should have the location of any and all structures including the house, driveway and any other accessory structures (shed, pool, fence etc.) with the dimensions of each listed. Setback distances are required from all installed structures (existing and proposed) to the adjacent property lines. We would also like to inform the residents that if there are any questions with regard to property corner locations, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to either provide a survey plan or accurate corner locations during the required site inspection.

A Use and Occupancy permit and inspection are required when transferring ownership of any residential or commercial property. Please note the Township has adopted Ordinance 2007-10 dated September 13, 2007 which outlines the expanded inspection criteria for the inspections of residential and commercial properties. A copy of the ordinances along with the permit applications are available on line at www.calntownship.org.

Backyard composting provides free, high-quality garden soil and saves money and energy by recycling. 




