WHAT TO DO WITH YOUR YARD WASTE?

RECYCLE YOUR GRASS CLIPPINGS

Grasscycling is the practice of leaving your grass clippings on the lawn rather than bagging them. As the clippings break down, they release moisture and nutrients into the soil. Grass clippings are 80% water - leaving them on the lawn will prevent excessive moisture loss and return water to the soil.

They decompose quickly and do not cause thatch. You can have a beautiful lawn using less water and fertilizer plus save time and money by leaving your grass clippings on the lawn.

What's more, grass clippings account for 75% of all yard waste, so leaving your grass clippings on the lawn helps save space in the landfill.

If you don't want to leave your clippings on your lawn, but still want to recycle them, you can bring them to the Caln Township Building, 253 Municipal Drive or Caln Park West, Kings Highway and drop them off in the designated bins. Grass clippings must be in a biodegradable bag. The clippings will be screened for trash and then composted.

BRANCHES/TWIGS

The Township offers a Chipping Program in both the Spring and Fall of each year. Each resident may sign up one time during both the Fall and Spring season (2 times total per year). This service is designed for routine clean-up and not meant to assist with clearing of properties and shrubs.

This program is for individual Caln Township residential properties only.

Items collected from outside the Township or through a private or commercial operation will not be processed.

Those residents that don't want to wait for the chipping program may bring branches to the drop off bin located behind the Township Building. Please follow the rules for what is accepted which is posted at the drop off bin.

YOU CAN HELP CALN TOWNSHIP DETECT STREAM POLLUTION!

Caln Township, as well as many other communities in the Southeastern Pennsylvania region, recently was required to obtain a permit from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection for its storm drainage system. This permit required Caln Township to locate and map all stormwater piping and drainage ditch systems owned and maintained by the Township. The permit also requires the Township to inspect these drainage systems periodically to detect any "illicit discharges" from the systems.

What in the world is an illicit discharge? Simply stated, an illicit discharge is something that is exiting a storm drainage pipe or drainage ditch that is not stormwater and potentially could pollute our streams. Examples of illicit discharges that would be typical for a community like ours are septic system overflows, sanitary wastewater, chlorinated pool water, paints, oil or other vehicle fluids, etc.

While the Township inspects its drainage system thoroughly, our Highways Department personnel cannot be everywhere all the time. If you happen to see something exiting a storm pipe or ditch that looks, smells or feels like something other than stormwater, please contact the Township's Engineering Department so we can track it to its source and keep our streams as clean and pure as possible. 



Caln Township Bird Walks

The third full year of monthly bird walks sponsored by Caln Township has been another success — both in turnout and in birds seen. Well over 100 participants have attended the walks, with a high of 47 on a single walk! And they were treated to some excellent finds. On our May walk, we discovered a Prothonotary Warbler — a first for Caln Township. On the 4-legged front, we were surprised to find a Mink feeding along the edge of Wedgwood Pond on our December walk.

Lloyd Park continues to yield a nice mixture of resident and migrating birds. Plus, the "Owl Prowls" at Lloyd Park have been truly spectacular. On one occasion, eight Screech Owls were located! Everyone there was treated to magnificent looks of these very elusive, nocturnal creatures. Elsewhere in the Township, the Woodcock fields along G.O. Carlson Blvd. held several of these amazing birds performing their unbelievable courtship flights in early spring.

So, come out and join the fun (see schedule below)! Just bring a pair of binoculars if you have them - we'll have a few binoculars to lend out, scopes, and field guides. You and your family or friends are certain to have a wonderful time enjoying the natural areas within Caln Township. It will be great exercise in the fresh air. The walks are free – sponsored by Caln Township.

To date, we have seen 168 bird species on our walks. The total species seen in Caln Township now stands at 195.

Your Local Police, Fire & Ambulance Service Needs Your Help!

When you call for help we want to find your home quickly and easily. If your address is not clearly marked we are not able to do this. In an effort to help you display your house number so that we can easily locate your home day or night, the Thorndale Fire Company is selling reflective address signs. The signs have a bright green background with 4 inch white reflective numbers on both sides. The signs are custom made and can be oriented in either horizontal or vertical depending on your mounting needs and can be seen from either direction.

We recommend the signs be mounted on your mailbox post or on a separate post at the end of your driveway. We have found that mounting the sign at the end of your driveway is the most effective way to ensure that emergency responders can find your residence the quickest. Minutes can save a life!

2012 ANNUAL FUND DRIVE IS UNDERWAY



"NO OPEN BURNING" - Reminder

Attention Public Sewer Customers Spring Reminder

Now that the weather will be getting nice, property owners are asked to inspect their own plumbing in order to identify illegal hookups and to remove any illegal connections to the public sewer system. For example, sump pump connections, floor drains, improper heights of sewer vent stacks and clean outs located in your yard which may be allowing surface water to run into the sewer system illegally. Illegal connections create an artificially high cost for sewer treatment. Currently the Township and Municipal Authority are doing all they can to stabilize and reduce high treatment costs by implementing a strict inflow and infiltration program to help stabilize and reduce these costs. Property owners can help reduce the amount of inflow and infiltration into the sanitary sewer by disconnecting illegal connections. Sump pumps which are harmlessly discharging outside onto the ground are not illegal and do not need attention.

Property owners should be aware that homes with illegal connections detected through other means (i.e.: dye testing, camera inspection) may ultimately be cited for being in violation of Resolution 2005-1-CTMA subsection 12A. This prohibits discharge of "any storm water, surface water, ground water, water from sump pumps or floor drains, roof runoff, subsurface drainage, cooling water or unpolluted industrial process waters." Penalties may be incurred as noted in Resolution 2005-1-CTMA subsection 35 which states, "violators may be punished by a fine of not less than \$100 and not more than \$1000 for each offense plus costs and attorney fees. Each separate building, each separate dwelling and each separate discharge in respect to which a violation occurs shall be deemed a separate offense."

SPRING LEAF AND YARD WASTE COLLECTION


Monday, May 7 to Friday, May 11

The Highways Department will be collecting leaf bags throughout the Township from May 7th to May 11th. Leaves must be in biodegradable bags and cannot be mixed with yard waste of any kind. Bags that have branches and other yard waste will not be collected.


TREE TRIMMING ALONG ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAYS


The Township Highways Department will be cutting back overhanging branches, brush and vegetation from the Township roadways as required to maintain clear and passable roadways. Overhanging trees obstruct the roadway when they are weighed down by snow, creating difficult situations for our snow removal vehicles. Please check the road frontage of your property to see if your trees or shrubs may be overhanging the road or obstructing street signs. If you prefer to prune back your own trees or shrubs, please use the following guidelines.

- 1. Tree branches and bushes should be clear of the road edge by a minimum of (24") two feet and that clearance should extend to (10') ten feet in height.
- 2. New plantings, i.e trees, shrubs, etc. should not be planted within the road right-of-way! Please contact the Township Zoning Office for these specifications prior to planting to avoid excess work.



OCHS RELEASES NEW REPLICA

The Old Caln Historical Society is pleased to announce the release of the Isaac Coates House replica. This fieldstone house is located on North Caln Road. In 1728, Irish Quaker, Moses Coates, purchased 492 acres that were once a part of the original Penn Grant of 1681. The house was built in 1779 by grandson, Isaac Coates, Quaker Elder and joiner, by trade. The interior consists of original random width oak and poplar floors and partitions measuring up to 23 inches. In 1960, the fourth owner, the James E. Rosser family, purchased this Caln Landmark.
