

CHIPPING GUIDELINES

Branches must be neatly stacked (no cross-stacking), no larger than 6" in diameter with cut ends facing the street. Crews won't go beyond the edge of the property and will not accept oversized piles.

Stumps, vines, weeds, grass, and leaves will not be collected and are reserved for the Yard Waste Collection Program.

POLICING WITH THE Community



POLICE officer of the Year 2015

Sergeant Steven Parkinson

Without question, the epidemic of heroin and opiate abuse and addiction has become one of the most significant concerns and threats to families and our community. Sergeant Parkinson consistently demonstrates tremendous dedication to narcotics detection and apprehension, knowing that drug abuse and addiction are the main drivers of property and violent crimes, heartbreak and often death.

In March 2015, Sergeant Parkinson and his squad were summoned to a physical domestic. He identified the presence of drug paraphernalia, and obtained a search warrant, which ultimately resulted in a large drug seizure and subsequent forfeiture of \$8.9K in suspected drug funds.

Additionally, Sergeant Parkinson is a strong proponent of education, and represents the Department on the Narcotics

Overdose Prevention & Education Task Force (NOPE), to educate school students and staff in an effort to save young lives.

As a result of his outstanding investigative skills, Sergeant Parkinson was temporarily assigned to the Department's Criminal Investigation Division in the Fall of 2015 to assist in the investigation of a proliferation of serious crimes that impacted the township in the latter half of 2015.

Medal of Valor – Criminal Investigator James Shaw



On March 10, 2015, CI Shaw risked his own life to save an elderly resident from a home that was fully engulfed in

flames. The victim, who nearly succumbed to smoke inhalation, made a full recovery. The Medal of Valor is the highest honor awarded to a member of the department.



WHAT'S New

The 2015 Municipal Complex Generator Project is the procurement and installation of backup generators for the Administration and Police Buildings at a cost of \$104,572. This project includes electrical engineering design, generator research and procurement through the COSTARS program, and construction of the site work and generator connection and implementation.

The project is now complete and was funded 100% by the Township's Capital Fund. Utilizing COSTARS we saved approximately \$10K given we bought directly through the supplier.
