CAPITAL PROJECTS COMPLETE



In 2008, the Township completed six major capital projects for a cost of \$2.96M, 60% of which was funded by County, State, and Federal Grants. The most notable project was the **Lincoln Highway Enhancements Project**, valued at \$1.2M. This project included the construction of curbing, sidewalks, and streetscape improvements along Lincoln Highway from Bondsville Road to approximately 900 feet east of North Bailey Road. As a follow-up to the Closed Loop Traffic Signal Project in 2007, this project completed the enhancements from State Route 340 to North Bailey Road.

The **Lloyd Park Improvements Project** improved Lloyd Park for a cost of \$411,000.00. This project includes a seventy (70) space parking area, two (2) beach volleyball courts, the relocation of an existing gazebo, and other associated improvements at the Township Park on Lloyd Avenue. 97% of this project was funded by State and County Grants.

The **Brandywine Homes HUD 2008 Project** replaced the sidewalks, curbing, and storm drain within this neighborhood. This streetscapes project was valued at \$980,000.00, 35% of which was funded by Federal Grants. This project completed a majority of the infrastructure upgrades needed in this neighborhood.

Overall, the Township performed a total of 7 major capital projects valued at \$2.96M. All projects were completed within contract timeframes and at or below budget.

BOARD ADOPTS 2009 BUDGET

The Board of Commissioners adopted the 2009 Annual Budget at a public meeting on December 18, 2008. Economic uncertainty and a slowing of revenues will provide for a difficult year. In response to this situation the Township cut expenditures in 2009 to an amount less than adopted in 2008. There will not be a Real Estate Tax increase in 2009. However, the annual trash fee will increase by \$10.00 a bill or \$60.00 per year to pay 75% of the anticipated \$1,000,000 trash budget. The General Fund will subsidize the rest. The annual trash fee is still one of the lowest in any Municipality in the area.

The Municipal Authority is implementing a \$7.00 per bill increase for the sewer operating fund in 2009 primarily to address increasing cost related to treatment of waste.

In 1986, she was promoted to Deputy Director of Finance, and in January of 1996 was promoted again to her current position of Finance Director. In December 1995, she began working full-time in Accounts Payable and assisting residents at the counter and on the telephone. In 1998, she also was elected Tax Collector for Caln Township and is now serving her third term. Millie has volunteered her time on the Caln Township Park and Recreation Board. Millie indicated, "The best thing about working for Caln, is that I can roll out of bed and into the office", since she only lives a couple of houses from the municipal building. But seriously, Millie said she enjoyed working with the many coworkers she has encountered over the years.

JANE'S DREAMS COME TRUE

In her gentle Quaker spirit Jane Moore was a historical treasure to Caln Township, a place she called home for more than 50 years. Early in the 1970's, when fires plagued the Old Caln Meetinghouse building on Route 340, Jane Moore, a nearby resident, joined with a small group of concerned citizens who then formed the Old Caln Historical Society. The Society's objectives are to bring together residents of the area interested in the history of the area, to assist in bringing recognition to historical sites in the area, to work for the retention of historical buildings, such as the Caln Meetinghouse, and to educate area residents in the history of the Old Caln area and act as a community resource for historical research. Jane became a soldier for this cause. Today this organization continues to work for these same goals.

Serving for many years as Secretary and President of OCHS, Jane worked to come up with creative ideas to involve the community to learn about our early settlement named for Calne, Wiltshire County, England. Jane wanted to share her passion for history with everyone. She was proud of our local museum and her wish was to have written documentation of historical properties in Caln Township. She wanted people to know that Caln was more than car sales lots, banks, and pizza shops along Route 30. In her last days, Jane was informed that the membership approved having local history author, Bruce Mowday, write a book about Caln Township. She was greatly pleased to know this written history dream so many of us shared was to become reality. Jane is sadly missed since her death on Tuesday, September 16, 2007.

HOME SECURITY 101

No one wants to return home from work, shopping, vacation, etc. and discover that their home has been entered and the belongings they worked so hard to acquire have been stolen or destroyed. Burglars, vandals, and other lawbreakers prefer committing crimes where the risk of being caught is low. Make your home and property as uninviting as you can. Use this list and take a few minutes to check the security around your home.

- 1. Do trees and shrubbery obscure your doors and windows?
- 2. Do shrubbery or structures provide a place where an intruder could hide?
- 3. Does your residence's appearance give the impression no one is home?
- 4. Are storage sheds or buildings unlocked?
- 5. Is the garage door unlocked or open?
- 6. Do you have a privacy fence?
- 7. Are there basement windows or an exterior basement door which is unlocked or easily opened?
- 8. Are there ground floor windows which are open, unlocked, have broken glass, or are otherwise inviting to an intruder?
- 9. Are there ground floor doors which are unlocked, have a broken pane of glass, or show other signs of being easy to enter?
- 10. Are there second floor windows or doors which are open or obviously unlocked?
- 11. Are there any other openings to your home such as skylights, crawl spaces, or vents that are unprotected?
- 12. Are there entrances to your home that are unlit at night?
- 13. Are there other areas around your home that are unlit and could provide concealment for an intruder?
- 14. Are cars or other vehicles left outside unlocked or with keys in the ignition?
- 15. Are vehicles parked in poorly lit areas?



NEWS FROM THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Spring Leaf Bag Collection April 13-17, 2009

The Highways Department will be collecting leaf bags throughout the Township the week of April 13th. Leaves must be in biodegradable bags and cannot be mixed with branches or debris of any kind. Bags that have debris and branches in them will not be picked up.



Tree Trimming along Road Right-of-ways

The Township Road Department will be cutting back overhanging branches, brush, and vegetation from the roadways as required to maintain clear and passable roadways throughout the Township. Overhanging trees obstruct the roadway when they are weighted down by snow, creating difficult situations for our snow removal vehicles. Please check the road frontage of your property to see if your trees or shrubs may be overhanging the road or obstructing street signs.

If you prefer to prune back your own trees or shrubs, please use the following as a guide:

- 1) Tree branches and bushes should be clear of the road edge by a minimum of (24") two feet and that clearance should extend to (10') ten feet in height.
- 2) New plantings, i.e. trees, shrubs, etc. should not be planted within the road right-of-way! Please contact the Township Zoning Office for these specifications prior to planting to avoid excess work.

*Trees and shrubs don't stay small - they only get larger.

FROM THE CODES DEPARTMENT...



The Code Enforcement office would like to remind the residents of Caln Township that plot plans are a required item for both Building and Zoning Permit submittal. Plot plans should have the location of any and all structures including the house, driveway and any other accessory structures (shed, pool, fence etc.) with the dimensions of each listed. Setback distances are required from all installed structures (existing and proposed) to the adjacent property lines. We would also like to inform the residents that if there are any questions with regard to property corner locations, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to either provide a survey plan or accurate corner locations during the required site inspection.

A Use and Occupancy permit and inspection are required when transferring ownership of any residential or commercial property. Please note the Township has adopted Ordinance 2007-10 dated September 13, 2007 which outlines the expanded inspection criteria for the inspections of residential and commercial properties. A copy of this ordinance along with the permit application is available on line at www.calntownship.org.

With cooler weather here, please remember your fire safety in regard to portable heaters and wood stoves.

Your Fire Department Needs Your Help!

Your local Fire Company needs your help in keeping your hydrants free of snow and other debris. The fire trucks only carry a small amount of water and we depend on the use of fire hydrants in the event of an emergency. If firefighters show up to your home and have to take time to clear away snow and ice from around the hydrant, then it slows us in getting to the real emergency. Help us help you. If you have a fire hydrant on your property or close to your home, please take the time to clear that surronding area. Thank you in advance for your help!





Caln Township, as well as many other communities in the Southeastern Pennsylvania region, recently was required to obtain a permit from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection for its storm drainage system. This permit required Caln Township to locate and map all stormwater piping and drainage ditch systems owned and maintained by the Township. The permit also requires the Township to inspect these drainage systems periodically to detect any "illicit discharges" from the systems.

What in the world is an illicit discharge? Simply stated, an illicit discharge is something that is exiting a storm drainage pipe or drainage ditch that is not stormwater and potentially could pollute our streams. Examples of illicit discharges that would be typical for a community like ours are septic system overflows, sanitary wastewater, chlorinated pool water, paints, oil or other vehicle fluids, etc.

While the Township inspects its drainage system thoroughly, our Highways Department personnel cannot be everywhere all the time. If you happen to see something exiting a storm pipe or ditch that looks, smells or feels like something other than stormwater, please contact the Township's Engineering Department so we can track it to its source and keep our streams as clean and pure as possible. Residents who want to take advantage of this free program should call 610-384-0600, x4 to schedule an appointment. Appointments will be taken through April 30, 2009.

IN AN EFFORT TO ACCOMMODATE ALL REQUESTS FOR APPOINTMENTS, WE REQUEST THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES BE STRONG-LY ADHERED TO WHEN USING THIS FREE CHIPPING SERVICE:

- All branches and limbs must be stacked at the front of the property next to the street (where trash cans are placed for pickup).
 Note: Due to liability concerns, the road crews will not drive onto property or private lanes/road ways, nor will road crews go beyond the edge of the property to collect the limbs.
- All branches should face the same direction (no cross-stacking) with the blunt/cut end facing the street.
- No stumps or limbs greater than 8" in diameter.
- A resident may use this service one time during the program period.
- No vines, weeds, leaves, or yard waste will be collected.
- THE PROGRAM IS FOR ROUTINE CLEAN-UP AND NOT DESIGNED TO ASSIST WITH CLEARING PROPERTIES OF TREES AND SHRUBS (I.E. CUTTING TREES DOWN AND PUTTING OUT FOR CHIPPING WILL NOT BE COLLECTED).
- This program is for individual Caln Township residential properties only. Items collected from outside the Township or through a private or commercial operation will not be processed.

Please call early to schedule an appointment as slots do fill up quickly.

Please note that your property will not be serviced without an appointment--no exceptions. THANK YOU!
