FALL Cleanup



LEAF VACUUMING will begin the week of October 30. Rather than bagging your leaves, you need only rake them to the front of your property immediately adjacent to the road's edge.

Leaves must be as close the road's edge as possible and not obstructed by vehicles. Please **DO NOT** rake leave into the street as they could get washed into storm inlets or freeze to the roadway during inclement weather.

Leaf vacuuming schedule:

- For Monday and Tuesday trash customers - leaf vacuuming will be the weeks of October 30th and November 13th.
- For Wednesday and Thursday trash customers - leaf vacuuming will be the weeks of November 6th and November 27th.
- One final Township-wide cleanup will take place the week of December 4th.

There is no appointment necessary for this service.

Eagle Disposal Leaf Bag Pick-up

In addition to Township leaf vaccuming, Eagle Disposal will again be collecting leaves that are placed at the curb in biodegradable bags as part of the Yard Waste Collection Program. See the trash and recycling schedule for more information.

Reminder:
The Caln Township Code prohibits burning yard waste or adding it to your trash or recycling pick-up.

The leaves collected by the Township are recycled into beneficial compost which is available free to residents at Caln Park West or behind the Caln Police Department. Visit www.chestercountyswa.org to learn more about composting.



DOGWOOD/SCOTT Sewer Project

The Caln Township Municipal Authority in conjunction with the Caln Township Board of Commissioners awarded a contract to extend public sewer to the Dogwood/Scott Drive area, making public sewer available to 54 homes served by on-lot systems. In 2002, a Township-wide study identified the neighborhood as one with a potential need for public sewer, based on well samples and a Sewage Needs Survey. Poor soils and small lots have caused problems for on-lot systems within this area in the past, making the Dogwood/Scott Drive Area a priority for the Authority. The project will provide a new public wastewater collection system for a neighborhood in need of an operating sewer solution. A grant in the amount of \$290,000 from the County of Chester Department of Community Development will be utilized to offset the cost of approximately 3,500' of new public sanitary sewer which will be installed this fall.

The Chester County Planning Commission is seeking input about a plan to extend the Chester Valley Trail westward across Chester County. The goal of the project is to connect the Chester Valley Trail with the future 29-mile multi-use Enola Low Grade Trail located just outside of Atglen in Lancaster County. The Chester Valley Trail West project includes eight Chester County municipalities: Caln, Downingtown, Coatesville, Valley, Parkesburg, Sadsbury, West Sadsbury, and Atglen.





Fall Safety Tips

Calm Township reminds you to keep safety in mind as the cooler fall weather moves many activities back indoors. The following safety tips will help you stay safe during the change of seasons:

- Safely store warm weather tools like lawn mowers and trimmers. Fuel for these items should be stored in a safe manner outside and away from the home, or in an approved flammable cabinet if in the garage. Check cold weather tools, such as leaf and snow blowers, along with their power cords, for unusual wear and tear. Repair or replace worn tools or parts right away.
- Unplug and safely store battery chargers that won't be in use again until spring.
- Use only weatherproof electrical devices for outside activities. Protect outdoor electrical devices from moisture. Make sure electrical equipment that has been wet is inspected and reconditioned by a certified repair dealer.
- Keep dry leaves swept away from outdoor lighting, outlets and power cords.



Land Developments

Wawa at Reeceville Road: Developers have obtained a partial building permit to install a foundation and fuel tanks. Once a full building permit is issued, likely sometime in November, construction will begin.


Wawa at Bondsville Rd. and Lincoln Highway: Developers are nearing completion of the land development work.

Carver Court Historical Plaque

On September 8th, the entrance to Carver Court was filled with local residents, history buffs, members of the media and many dignitaries, including Governor Tom Wolf, for the unveiling of a plaque commemorating Carver Court's addition to the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP). Carver Court was added to the NRHP in 2016, after local resident Jane Kennedy, with help from Representative Harry Lewis, completed the lengthy nomination process required to add a place to the Register. Calm Township Commissioners Jennifer Breton and John Contento were on hand to accept proclamations from Governor Wolf and Representative Lewis on behalf of the Township.




