RECYCLING AND TRASH UPDATE

Since the Township distributed the Recycling carts to each home in the Township back in September 2010, recycling has been up over 50%. The Board of Commissioners would like to thank the residents for their help in making this transition an overwhelming success. The Township's goal is to have over a third of what is disposed of by residents to be recycled. Currently we are at about 18%, so work still needs to be done. There have been a few questions/issues presented on a consistent basis. Below are a few answers to these concerns:

- 1. You do not need to put your cart out every week for collection. If you only fill your cart every other week that is fine.
- 2. Please make sure to document your cart's serial number and have your house # and street clearly marked on your cart.
- 3. If the hauler did not collect your trash or recycling, please contact the Township.
- 4. If you have not received a cart or have received two carts, please contact the Township so we can make arrangments to drop off or pick up a cart.
- 5. If the cart is full you can put recyclables in another container next to your cart, and the hauler will collect them.
- 6. Please remember to keep the lid on your trash can and recycling cart closed, to keep animals and rain water out.

CALN TOWNSHIP 2011 BUDGET

Due to the economic downturn in late 2008, the Township Budgets in 2009 and 2010 were less than 2008. Budget cuts had been implemented in almost every work area of the Township operations. The adopted 2011 Budget continues the trend to keep the budget tight while providing essential services.

During 2011 there will be a 5% increase in the General Fund. This is because the General Fund will be transferring over \$200,000 from the Fund Balance to replenish Township capital accounts. Consistent with good budgeting, annual operating costs will be less than annual projected revenues. The budget reflects operational cuts in most work areas as well as departmental staffing limitations. Also, the Township will be using its own crew to complete a number of paving and stormwater projects in 2011 in order to save additional dollars.

The 2011 budget keeps the Real Estate Tax rate at 2.808 mils. This is the 7th year in a row without a Real Estate Tax increase in Caln Township. The fee for trash and recycling collection and disposition will increase from \$35 to \$40 every two months. This increase allows the Solid Waste Fund (trash/recycling) to remain self-sufficient, while absorbing the costs of the new recycling carts distributed in 2010 and projected increases in landfill tipping fees. There will also be an increase to the assessment charged for street lights due to rising electrical costs in those neighborhoods subject to an annual street light assessment. The average street light assessment will increase by \$4.40.

The Caln Township Municipal Authority has adopted its 2011 Budget. A rate increase of \$5.00 per bill was approved. This will be reflected in the March 1, 2011 sewer bill.

The following table summarizes expenditures in the 2011 budget.

Important information for Sewer/Trash Bills for 2011

Rates

The Sewer rate (which begins with the March bill) will be \$59 per bill. The Trash/Recycling rate (which begins with the March bill) will be \$40 per bill. For those residents who have both Public Sewer and Trash service, the total bi-monthly bill will be \$99.00.

Payment Due Date

The due date for all bills has changed from the last day of the month to the 25th day of the month. Please ensure that you allow enough time for your payment to reach the Township. If you pay via an on-line bank payment system, please initiate your payment with the bank to allow for both bank processing time and mailing/delivery time. All on-line payments received by the Township are via a mailed paper check - we do not receive electronic payments from any bank.

If you are making your payment through an on-line banking payment system, please direct them to make payment as follows:

Your account number should be listed on all on-line checks to ensure that your account is properly posted. The account number is two fields separated by a dash (-). Please make sure both fields are shown on your payment. Example: xxxx - 0



FROM THE HIGHWAYS DEPARTMENT

Spring Leaf Collection April 4 through April 8, 2011

The Highways Department will be collecting leaf bags throughout the Township from April 4th to April 8th. Leaves must be in biodegradable bags and cannot be mixed with vard waste of any kind. The leaf bags can be purchased starting March 21st at the Township Building. Bags that have branches and other yard waste will not be collected.

TREE TRIMMING ALONG ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAYS

The Township Highways Department will be cutting back overhanging branches, brush and vegetation from the Township roadways as required to maintain clear and passable roadways. Overhanging trees obstruct the roadway when they are weighed down by snow, creating difficult situations for our snow removal vehicles. Please check the road frontage of your property to see if your trees or shrubs may be overhanging the road or obstructing street signs. If your prefer to prune back your own trees or shrubs, please use the following guidelines.

- 1. Tree branches and bushes should be clear of the road edge by a minimum of (24") two feet and that clearance should extend to (10') ten feet in height.
- 2. New plantings, i.e trees, shrubs, etc. should not be planted within the road right-of-way! Please contact the Township Zoning Office for these specifications prior to planting to avoid excess work.

2011 BIRD WALKS with Early Bird Tours

The second full year of monthly bird walks sponsored by Caln Township has been a resounding success — both in turnout and in birds seen. Well over 130 participants have attended the walks, with a high of 47 on a single walk! And they were treated to some excellent finds. On our May walk, we discovered a Ruby-throated Hummingbird building a nest mere feet away from the group. We were able to watch her as she molded the nest around her body, making numerous trips to get more supplies. The group was able to visit the nest on subsequent walks, seeing her feeding the young and eventually fledging three birds from the incredibly tiny structure! On a much larger scale, Bald Eagles and Ospreys were seen on many occasions.


Lloyd Park continues to yield a nice mixture of resident and migrating birds. Plus, the Owl Prowls at Lloyd Park have been truly spectacular. On one occasion, eight Screech Owls were located! Everyone there was treated to magnificent looks of these very elusive, nocturnal creatures. Elsewhere in the township, we have found surprising birds in surprising places. A resident brought to our attention a field where he has seen American Woodcock perform their amazing courtship display. Sure enough, we took a group over and there they were, flying hundreds of feet into the air and performing acrobatic aerial feats while descending to the ground! We will have to make this an annual special event in April.

Keep Fire Hydrants Clear of Snow

While we are all looking forward to spring and warmer weather, we want to remind you that it's important to keep fire hydrants clear of snow so they are easily accessible should the need arise. If you have a fire hydrant that is in front of or near your house, take the extra time to clear the snow from around the hydrant so it is visible to responding units and the connections can be accessed. During an emergency, if the firefighter has trouble finding the hydrant or if they need to dig it out in order to make the hose connections at the height of the emergency, it will delay and hamper any firefighting efforts. It's during this time that seconds count from being a situation easily controlled to a potential complete loss of property. In addition, some of the hydrants in the township have a metal stake on them with color indications. These again are on the hydrants for a quick visual means of knowing where a hydrant is located. If the hydrant near you has this stake on it, please make sure it is sticking up in the air. Your help in maintaining the hydrants during inclement weather is greatly appreciated. For those residents that assist in maintaining them on a regular basis, thank you as your efforts do not go unnoticed.

On December 9, 2010, Mike Garber, Paul (PJ) Groff, and William (Billy) Lewis, participated in the Chester County Emergency Services Training Center Graduation Ceremony honoring them for the successful completion of the state and national level Firefighter 1 class. The Firefighter 1 class is the basic firefighting class that all members wishing to be interior firefighters must obtain before reaching that status. We are proud of these members on their success and want to wish them well as they enter into the ranks of certified firefighters.

Chester County's Public Safety Training Facility

The culmination of many years of work and negotiation reached an important milestone in the Chester County Public Safety Training Facility project on November 23, 2010 when Chester County took ownership of over 92 acres in South Coatesville Borough that was formerly owned by ArcelorMittal Steel.

The property is off Modena Road across the street from the South Coatesville Borough Hall and adjacent to the ArcelorMittal Administrative Resources Center (ARC). Included in the purchase is an approximate 22,000 square foot building that was previously used by ArcelorMittal as the research and development (R&D) and medical building. The County Commissioners held a kickoff event at the facility on December 8, 2010 at 1pm with apparatus from local Fire Companies, Police and EMS units featured at the event. "Chester County Commissioner Kathi Cozzone said "It's incredibly wonderful to see that we are finally at a place where we have a location and are moving along."

Commissioner Terence Farrell explained that the site will also eventually be home to a "burn building" where firefighters will be able to practice fire response under controlled conditions; a search-and-rescue building; a sixstory training tower to practice high-rise operations; and a vehicle burn training area along with facilities for police firearms certification and specialized training.

Commissioner Carol Aichele stressed that almost every emergency response in the county involves cooperation between police, fire and emergency medical services personnel, but various agencies currently have very little opportunity to train together in the county.

Cozzone called the building "one of the most interesting places" she has spoken in as a Commissioner. "The rough and ready state of this building is evidence of the fact that we've just been handed the keys," she added, calling the training center one of the six priority areas identified within the Commissioners' strategic plan. Cozzone finished by saying that development of the facility will begin in late spring 2011.

IN AN EFFORT TO ACCOMMODATE ALL REQUESTS FOR APPOINTMENTS, WE REQUEST THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES BE STRONG-LY ADHERED TO WHEN USING THIS FREE CHIPPING SERVICE:

- All branches and limbs must be stacked at the front of the property next to the street (where trash cans are placed for pickup).
 Note: Due to liability concerns, the road crews will not drive onto property or private lanes/road ways, nor will road crews go beyond the edge of the property to collect the limbs.
- · All branches should face the same direction (no cross-stacking) with the blunt/cut end facing the street.
- No stumps. Limbs greater than 8" in diameter are not accepted.
- A resident may use this service one time during the program period.
- · No vines, weeds, leaves, or yard waste will be collected.
- THE PROGRAM IS FOR ROUTINE CLEAN-UP AND NOT DESIGNED TO ASSIST WITH CLEARING PROPERTIES OF TREES AND SHRUBS (I.E. CUTTING TREES DOWN AND PUTTING OUT FOR CHIPPING WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED).
- This program is for individual Caln Township residential properties only. Items collected from outside the Township or through a private or commercial operation will not be processed.

Please call early to schedule an appointment as slots do fill up quickly.
