## Riparian Buffer Planting - Lloyd Park

With the help of the Chester County Conservation District and Penn State Extension Master Watershed Stewards, the township will be planting a riparian buffer in Lloyd Park this fall. Consisting of 500 native trees and shrubs, the buffer will help protect Beaver Creek, which runs through the park, from pollution runoff and stream bank erosion. Once established, the buffer will help keep the water cool (a benefit for fish and other water-dwellers), provide habitat for wildlife, and enrich park visitor's experience. Volunteers will be needed for the planting event - more information coming soon!




# CALN THEN AND NOW

## FROM THE CALN HISTORICAL COMMISSION



In the early 1900's, some of Caln's many farms had begun taking advantage of modern farming technology. Ingleside Farm (pictured above) was especially keen to make a name for itself in modern farming. In 1912, a newspaper reported that Ingleside's owners were planting 50 acres of tobacco and 50 of potatoes, in addition to a massive egg growing operation. "This is something entirely new for Chester County to farm on such a large scale." A few days later, another article said "Those who had occasion to be near the Ingleside Farm, Thorndale, yesterday afternoon witnessed an unusual sight. One man in charge of some machinery in a large field was turning up four furrows at one time!"



Another farm, "Lyndhurst" was located along today's Lincoln Highway (near where the Acme stands today). When electricity was installed in the barn, locals began calling it the "Electric Farm." The nickname must have stuck because the owners had it painted on the side of the barn.
