Minquas Fire Company #2

Minquas Fire Company #2 has been providing ambulance services to the Downingtown area since the 1920s and as of January 2023, they are also the primary EMS and ALS provider for all of Caln Township. Minquas has six transport-capable units and two chase units, all fully equipped to provide advanced life support. In order to better serve Caln residents, they have established a staffed Mobile Intensive Care Unit based at the Thorndale fire station.

With over 50 staff members, Minquas provides ambulance services for Downingtown Borough, East Caln, and East Brandywine, in addition to Caln Township, plus much of West Bradford, and a small area of Marsh Creek and Upper Uwchlan. They're on pace to receive about 5500 calls this year. Minquas is a leader in the region for pilot programs and new initiatives which allows them to provide cutting edge patient care.

When they're not out on calls or in training, Minquas provides a number of community services. They offer car seat checks 7 days a week from 6AM to 6PM and they also have car seats available to loan in case of emergency. Businesses and organizations can reach out to them to conduct CPR trainings in the community. And of course, Minquas supports a variety of public events, including many here in Caln by being on-site in case an ambulance or first aid is needed. They even have a transport-capable ATV for maneuvering through crowds.

Minquas offers ambulance memberships for families for \$100/year. A family membership covers everyone in a household. With a membership, you will not be responsible for any fees charged by Minquas EMS for 911 services that are not covered by your insurance. Memberships run from January 1 to December 31 each year. According to EMS Chief Andrew Steward, Minquas receives a lot of heat emergency calls throughout the summer. He emphasized the importance of hydration on warm days, especially for seniors and kids.

On July 20, 2023, Caln's Spackman-Davis Farm hosted over 300 visitors as part of the Chester County Planning Commission's Town Tours and Village Walks series. Guests were brought by trolley to the farm where they were led around the farmhouse, barn, and outbuildings to hear the stories of the Spackman family. Actors played the parts of Isaac Spackman and his descendants with scripts written by Caln Commissioner Mark Evans. Before the event, volunteers from the Caln Historical Commission and the Old Caln Historical Society cleaned and staged the property to prepare for the tour. They also created displays featuring the farm's history for guests to peruse. The groups hope to host more events at the farm in the future.
